About the role

Instrumental Music Tutors should be approachable and have an ability to provide a warm and positive service to our community of students. Instrumental Music Tutors of piano, voice, percussion, trumpet, woodwind or lower brass form the Instrumental Music Program

You will work collaboratively with students and staff supporting the development of the music and performing arts culture and programs. Your experience leading and conducting ensembles is highly desirable.

Instrumental Music Tutors will have appropriate qualifications and experience and be able to:

- Teach beginner students and more advanced students (Year 7 12) in the Instrumental Music Program with experience in VCE Music performance studies being an advantage.
- Teach a wide range of music genres.
- Offer individual music tuition or choir, ensemble, direction.
- Assist with the Year 7 curriculum-based music classes, alongside a VIT registered teacher.
- Lead or accompany instrumental ensembles if required.
- Foster and develop the Instrumental Music Program.
- Engage in the life of the school beyond the music program when required.
- Work collaboratively and productively with colleagues and students in supporting the development of the music and performing arts culture.

Every Year 7 student begins their studies in music with an intensive practical program including learning an instrument and participating in class ensembles. Year 7 students participate in a semester-long instrumental music program as part of classroom music. The College provides students with an instrument to use during the program. Instrumental Music Tutors join classroom Teachers for these classes.
